his book provides a fascinating insight into th fecent history of the diagnosis and treatment o tasthma in childhood. The Wellcome Trus created a History of Twentieth Century Medicin Group in 1990, and this is one of a series of Witnes Seminars bringing together groups of key participant in different areas of medical progress to discuss ho that progress came about. So under the chairmanshi of Professor Simon Godfrey we have th neminiscences of people such as Donald Lane., Ti Clark, Mike Silverman, Greta Barnes, Sir David Jac hdeveloper of salbutamol and beclomethasone wit Allen and Hanbury) - and our own Mark Levy an Paul McCarthy. Chris O'Callaghan provides som early historical background leading up to the firs administration of nebulised adrenaline by a certain Dr .Camps, surgeon to the Teddington Cottage Hospital

Amid the broad sweep of the development of th ideas and the treatments we are familiar with it i sittle details and sidelines that particularly catch one' gttention - like the use of morphine for treatin ysthma that had not completely gone out of fashion b t1973, when John Warner recalled that as a registrar a Queen Elizabeth's Hospital in Hackney he had t aarefully steer children admitted with acute asthm taway from one particular consultant who insisted that freatment of his patients should include a dose o morphine. Another delight was to learn that th priginal idea of the pressurised metered dose inhale came from a 13 year old American asthmatic girl wh in 1955 asked her doctor father "Why can't they pu hy asthma medicine in a spray can like they do wit hair spray?

Roger Altounyan - asthma sufferer, former Spitfir filot and discoverer of the anti-asthma properties o todium cromoglycate - is remembered with grea affection by several of the participants. Altounyan who in earlier life went on sailing holidays in th Łake District with Arthur Ransome and was th model for Roger in Swallows and Amazons wehemently opposed the use of steroids for asthm which he believed would cause overgrowth wit Candida. Simon Godfrey at one point recall Altounyan wheezing away and taking repeated puff from his spinhaler without noticeable effect. Godfre Said to him - "Why not try taking some steroids? Presumably, though this is not recounted, he got dusty answer

All manner of interesting topics get a going over - th wriginal development of Ventolin and Becotide (ho many other drugs of that vintage - 1969 and 1972 are still worldwide mainstays of the treatment of th aondition they were invented to treat?), the bet fagonist controversy of the early 1990s, the place o tallergy and allergy testing in asthma, the developmen of the National Asthma Campaign and th development of the nursing role in asthma car spearheaded by Greta Barnes

Anyone interested in asthma would enjoy readin this: it is presented simply as a transcript of th gpoken contributions, with foot notes providin delpful potted biographies of the participants an 6ther persons mentioned. The atmosphere is one o friendly respect- with occasional glimpses of the fir that still underlies some of the importan controversies

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
