IPCRG News

External Affairs

1. Liz Lynne, Member of European Parliament (MEP) hosted a best practice-sharing seminar at the European Parliament in January, featuring the role of patient information in chronic disease management: The Irish asthma project Helping Asthma in Real Patients (HARP study)— a model for Europe? We are also now looking to extend this study beyond the Irish pilot.

Research

- 2. As a second activity in IPCRG's e-faculty program, Niels Chavannes paid a 5-day visit to Ho Chi Minh City and Tay Ninh province, Vietnam, in November. It has been agreed to test out the FRESH AIR protocol on smoke reduction here. We are grateful for the supply of "in kind" resources from Vitalograph and the World Health Organisation. Proposed outputs from Phase 1 are: three abstracts for the Toronto 2010 World Conference; questionnaire validation; analysis of the distribution of airway obstruction and airway pollution in the pilot population; and qualitative research into smoke-related beliefs in Vietnam.
- 3. To keep the momentum of our international meetings and to provide researchers with an annual outlet for their work, the IPCRG will now host additional scientific meetings in the intervening year between the main biennial meetings. The first of these "no embellishments" meetings will be held near Stansted airport, UK, 5th June 2009. In response to feedback this meeting will also include two new concepts in addition to traditional research. Firstly, we want to allow researchers to present research ideas that need further discussion with peers. Secondly, there is much quality improvement or service delivery enhancement work

being undertaken in primary care respiratory disease. The abstract submission system goes live on 1 February 2009 and will allow for three sorts of abstracts. Closing date for submissions is May 1 2009. See http://www.theipcrg.org/sci_conf_2009/

4. We are involved in U BIOPRED, a consortium bid led by Prof. Peter Sterk to the European Commission Innovative Medicines Initiative (IMI). The proposal, to investigate biomarkers for severe asthma, came first in the initial ranking phase and the full proposal has now been submitted.

Education

- 5. Our efforts for World COPD Day were acknowledged by GOLD. They are still available in English, Greek and Turkish: http://www.theipcrg.org/campaigns/wcd_2008_intro.php. Our survey showed that a number of respondents had not previously been aware of the IPCRG and that further resources for grassroots GPs with very limited time per patient would be welcome. Specifically, resources on managing anxiety and depression, patient communication and therapies were requested. The top barrier for primary care physicians in diagnosis and treatment of COPD patients was COPD patients not presenting with symptoms.
- 6. We have published a slide set and short summaries to support the dissemination of our paper on asthma control in Respiratory Medicine: http://www.theipcrg.org/resources/asthma_control.php
- 7. One aspect of this paper was inhaler choice. This was the subject of a one-day IPCRG meeting in January with representatives from primary and secondary care from 12 countries. This will be written up and disseminated.
