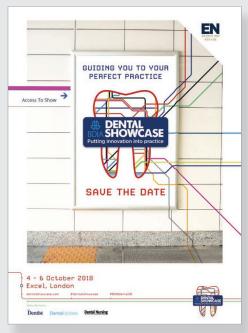
It's back, and better than ever
